Potter Ka Kai Fong, from Batu Pahat, Johor, Malaysia, was appointed by International President A.P. Singh to serve a one-year term as a member of the Lions International Board of Directors at the association's 107th international convention in Orlando, Florida, USA from July 13 through July 17, 2025.

Director Potter is the founder of BeBetterTogether Training & Consultancy and has more than 10 years of professional experience in education, training and youth development.

He first became a Leo in 2002 when he joined the Leo Club of SMK Dato Syed Esa. He is currently a Leo-Lion member with the Leo-Lions Club of Batu Pahat United, the first Leo-Lions Club in Multiple District 308. He has served in numerous leadership roles including club president (both Leo and Lions), district Lions Quest chairperson, multiple district Leo chairperson, district governor, council chairperson, Global Action Team (GAT) area leader, Leo Club Advisory Panel member, Youth Engagement Ad Hoc Committee member, and Leo-Lion board liaison in 2019–2020.

Director Potter is a qualified LCIP Instructor and has served as a group leader for the District Governors-Elect Seminar and as faculty for multiple LCIP, Faculty Development Institute (FDI), Advanced Lions Leadership Institute (ALLI), and Emerging Lions Leadership Institute (ELLI).

In recognition of his service, he has received numerous awards, including Leos of the Year Award, multiple International President's Leadership Awards, multiple International President's Awards, the LCIF Helping Hands Award and the 100 Percent Club Support Certificate of Appreciation.
