

TA-LUNG CHIANG
PAST INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR

Ta-Lung Chiang, from Taichung, China Taiwan, was elected to serve a two-year term as a director of The International Association of Lions Clubs at the association's 93rd International Convention, held in Sydney, Australia, June 28 to July 2, 2010.

Past Director Chiang is the founder of the Yu-Da Education Institution.

A member of the Changkung Lions Club and a Lion since 1992, Past Director Chiang has held many offices within the association, including club president, zone chairperson, region chairperson, district committee chairperson, vice district governor and district governor. He was the Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) board appointee from 2015-2016 and 2020-2021 and was appointed trustee to LCIF from 2010-2012 and 2019-2022.
