LIONS IN KOREA EMBRACE A NEW CAUSE AREA



In Korea, Lions see community members struggling with food insecurity and feel compelled to respond. Inspired by one of Lions' new cause areas, and empowered by Lions

Clubs International Foundation (LCIF), Lions across Korea are serving hungry people in their communities.

Using District and Club Community Impact grants (DCGs) from LCIF, Lions are holding food drives, serving hot meals, and stocking kitchens with nutritious meals.

"We love to meet and interact with people we are helping," said Lion Sung-Jin. "It makes us feel closer to our community."

Empowered by LCIF, Lions across Korea are serving the hungry.

"It's inspiring to see Lions come together to serve, especially in my home country," said International President Jung-Yul Choi. "Lions are kind, compassionate, and generous people. And I'm so proud to be a part of the incredible impact we're making in Korea and in communities around the world."

Along with providing DCGs grants, LCIF supports larger Lion projects with Hunger grants. With support from local Lions clubs and LCIF, citizens who once struggled with food insecurity are now eating hot meals, putting dinner on their tables at home, and becoming healthier.

Despite sufficient global food production, chronic hunger remains a chronic problem. Political and economic instability, rising food and energy prices, and climate change all contribute to this sad truth: Hunger-related challenges are urgent in this part of the world.
